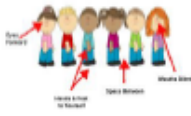
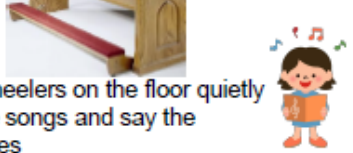
Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports



Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework is a school-wide system that uses proactive strategies to teach, model, recognize, and reinforce positive student behavior. Our goal is to create a safe, positive, and consistent learning environment throughout our school. Often, we tell our students that PBIS stands for *Positive Behavior in SOCIETY* because we hope the values, faith, and Catholic identity they develop at St. Cletus extend far beyond our school walls. Since it has been a few years since we first introduced PBIS, we want to make sure all of our families, both new and returning, understand what PBIS looks like. At St. Cletus, our behavior expectations are grounded in our core Cardinal values:

Be Respectful. Be Responsible. Be Compassionate, BE A CARDINAL!

We encourage you to ask your child about PBIS, the cardinal values, and the ways they are working to demonstrate **respect, responsibility, and compassion** each day, not only at school, but also at home and within their communities. Our hope is that these values become more than just school expectations; we want our students to carry them with them and live them out wherever they go. As always, thank you for your partnership and for helping to make St. Cletus a safe, welcoming, and positive place for every student to learn and grow.
